

We do not have the finances from the show yet, and I assume we did make some profit, but profit is not the mark of a successful show as far as I am concerned. We just don't want to lose money too bad. The VNA board is already working on aspects of the 2019 Convention and all your help is appreciated.

I do have some bad news; two dealers and members of the VNA passed away. Matt DeRoma passed in August, and Barry Ciciola passed in October. Both participated in many VNA conventions. Barry was extremely active in both Virginia and North Carolina shows. Both will be sorely missed.

The next VNA board meeting is on Sunday, December 11, 2018 at 07:30 AM, in conjunction with the Annandale Coin Show at the NOVA campus, off Little River Turnpike. All are welcome. We will be discussing the last and next conventions, and other matters related to the affairs of the VNA.

Numismatic Education

At this year's 2018 VNA Convention we held 7 educational classes, ongoing youth treasure hunts, and a Boy Scout coin collecting merit badge certification program. We had 28 adults, 54 homeschoolers, and 53 boy scouts attend classes. 125 youth participated in our Treasure Hunts. 33 BSA coin collecting merit badges were awarded. Over 3,250 coins were given out.

Over the past 8 years of our program, the VNA has awarded 227 coin collecting merit badges. Special thanks to Darrell Tyler for assisting with these BSA merit badge certification classes.

Both adults and youth students were treated to 2 very special guest speakers over the VNA Convention weekend. Tom Wood (Apoth Coins, Lynchburg, VA) spoke about Jefferson Nickels; and Tom Wood (Ephesus Numismatics, Durham, N.C) taught about biblical coins. (P.S. Not a typo. Both speakers with identical names: "Tom Wood." {What are the chances of that?}).

About the Cover

Ten Pound Note of Virginia, April 12, 1758 (Fr. VA-14.1)

Pictured on the cover is one of the great rarities from Virginia, printed by William Hunter, with a large coat of arms at left and new border cuts (two with the 1758 date within), signed by Peyton Randolph and Robert Carter Nicholas. Randolph served in the House of Burgesses and Virginia Conventions; he died in Philadelphia in 1775, while serving as the first president of the Continental Congress. Currency notes were authorized for Virginia in June 1755, much later than in New England. The notes prior to 1773 share a common style, with the Virginia Colony Coat of Arms, and square format, on laid paper. Most were heavily used to the point of requiring backing, sewing, pins, and other means to continue circulating as long as possible. No one is to be left behind or treated as a second-class citizen because they are not computer literate, or don't have a computer or mobile device.

PRINT – VNA members receive *The Virginia Numismatist* four times a year in printed form. Its traditional style with glossy covers, black & white images, and basic format have stayed the same for many decades. Delivery by mail may take weeks from when each edition goes to print.

ONLINE ELECTRONIC ARCHIVES - New in 2018, the VNA posted decades of back issues of *The Virginia Numismatist* to the Newman Numismatic Portal (NNP). We hope to complete the archive with all back issues and are looking to borrow missing editions for digital scanning and return to the owner.

Eric P. Newman's first numismatic publication, on Missouri paper money, appeared in 1941. In the ensuing years, Newman published widely in the field of colonial coinage, early American paper money, and counterfeit detection. Newman's research activities were pure "old school" — personal visits to libraries and historical societies scattered throughout the country, voluminous correspondence with archivists and fellow collectors, and the accumulation of research files on hundreds of topics. Today's technology has revolutionized these activities. Research efforts once requiring substantial time and expense can be reduced to a few keystrokes. The Newman Numismatic Portal will extend the Newman legacy of scholarly research by making freely available the largest online archive of numismatic information in the The all-seeing eye is emblematic of the Newman Numismatic world. Portal, the goal of which is to freely share a vast online store of both printed and virtual numismatic resources. Books, periodicals, ephemera, as well as online forums and auction offerings will be captured in one location, freely available, and searchable from anywhere in the world. With unprecedented knowledge at their disposal, collectors and researchers will gain greater appreciation for numismatic science and more clearly discern fact from fiction.

The NNP has digitized well over one million pages of numismatic content, and provides discovery and word search capability, within a growing, specialized archive of rare numismatic titles, books, periodicals, auction catalogs, and ephemera that no single, physical library could hold. We thank Eric P. Newman and the Eric P. Newman Numismatic Education Society (EPNNES) for sponsoring VNA Educational Programs and for providing us all with free access to the NNP online search engine, vast numismatic archives. images, Start libraries. and browsing https://nnp.wustl.edu See archives of The Virginia Numismatist back to 1965, under "Periodicals" and then select the letter "V" to find links to back issues by year; select the year and then select your preferred download mode such as in PDF, full text, or kindle to page through selected volumes, viewed on-line, or locally.

Proposed New Technology for VNA in 2019



VNA E-NEWSLETTER - We plan to offer each VNA member their choice to continue receiving printed media, sent via U.S. Mail, or by fast online notification by email. We will provide email notification with the link to download the current edition each quarter, sent at the same time as the print edition goes to the printers. Advantages of

receiving The Virginia Numismatist by email include:

- Faster delivery When the editor pushes the send button your notification and link to the new edition, ready for download, will arrive within seconds, not weeks.
- **Color** Articles in electronic copy will have color images, not available in the black and white printed copy.
- **Back Issues** New editions and back issues will be posted on line and notifications sent by email for "one-click" access. Files can be read online or downloaded to your device.
- On Demand Prints You can print selected pages, images, or full editions using your own printer.
- Large Print You can zoom-in to increase page size, making for easier reading and to see photo details of selected pages or images.
- **Electronic Archive** You can electronically save each new issue in a "paperless folder" on your device preventing paper clutter around the house.
- **Sharing** You can email, text, or Instagram images and excerpts from *The Virginia Numismatist* with friends, send links to articles and entire issues, or send the links to file copies to share an issue, an article, an image, or fuel online discussion about numismatic finds in chat rooms and blogs.
- Cost Savings The VNA expects to save money if many folks want electronic copy only
- Extras Electronic-only, online "extras" may be soon be available.

Collection of email addresses for those who opt in, will help develop the VNA email distribution list. All personal email information will continue to be handled as "confidential," only used for conducting VNA business, and not shared with anyone else, for any other purpose.
